


Quotation Marks


Form A: "Quotation marks can be tricky," remarked Ben.

Put quotation marks at the beginning and end of this phrase.

RULE #1 - QUOTATION MARKS ENCLOSE THE WORDS THAT THE CHARACTER SAID.

CAN YOU COME TO MY HOUSE AFTER SCHOOL ASKED LACEY.

Let's move on to the next rule.

RULE #2

USE A TAG AT THE BEGINNING, IN THE MIDDLE, OR AT THE END OF THE DIALOGUE.

A gift tag tells who is giving and receiving a present...

A dialogue tag tells who is speaking in a conversation!

(Place the tag at the end of the sentence.)
