Definitions at a Glance

megabucks: a “big” amount of money (colloquial term)

megabyte: a “big” unit of measurement in computer science applied to one million bytes (*byte* = a unit of data) (specialized term)

megadose: a “big” dose of medicine

megalith: a “big” stone used in prehistoric monuments (*lith* = stone)

megalomania: a passion or madness for “big” things (*mania* = mad, crazy)

megalomaniac: one who is crazy about owning “big” things and doing things on a grand scale

megapolis: an especially “big” city or urban area (*polis* = city)

megaphone: a cone-shaped device that makes one’s voice “bigger” and louder (*phon* = voice, sound)

megapower: a country with “big” power and influence in world events

megastar: a celebrity or performer with a “big” reputation

megastore: a “big” store that sells a variety of merchandise in large quantities

megaton: a “big” unit of measurement applied to one million tons (*ton* = 2,000 pounds) (specialized term)

megavitamin: a “big” dose or quantity of a vitamin exceeding daily recommended allowance (*vita* = life)

megawatt: a “big” unit of measurement applied to one million watts (*watt* = a unit of electrical power) (specialized term)
